

## Natural Family Planning (NFP) Awareness Week July 19–25, 2020

"Live the truth and beauty of God's plan for married love!" is the theme of this year's Natural Family Planning Awareness Week, a national educational campaign of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) to celebrate God's design for married love and the gift of life and to raise awareness of Natural Family Planning (NFP) methods. "NFP," as the U.S. bishops have written, is supportive of Catholic beliefs about married love because it "respects the God-given power to love a new human life into being" (see, U.S. Bishops, *Married Love and the Gift of Life*).

The dates of Natural Family Planning Awareness Week (July 19–25, 2020) annually highlight the anniversary of *Humanae vitae* (July 25) as well as the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne (July 26), the parents of the Blessed Mother.

Participation in an Introduction to Natural Family Planning is required of all couples of child bearing age preparing for marriage in the diocese. Couples

## Seven members of Deacon Formation Class VIII will be instituted as Lectors this Sunday, July 12 at 3pm at the Cathedral.

These seven members and their wives include **St. Boniface parishioner, Mike Linnenbrink (Liz)**, Ryan Burchett (Monica) of St. Paul the Apostle, Kent Ferris (Lori) of SS. Mary & Mathias, Andy Hardigan (Shannon) of Jesus Christ, Prince of Peace, Angel Hernandez (Lourdes) of St. Patrick, Gary Johnson (Theresa) of Divine Mercy Parish and Andrew Reif (Tracy) of St. Mary, Dodgeville. They will then begin their third year of Candidacy.

According to the Church's law and practice, the instituted lector is charged with proclaiming the readings from the Sacred Scriptures (except for the Gospel), announcing the intentions in the Prayer of the Faithful (in the absence of a Deacon), and reciting or singing the psalm if there is no cantor (GIRM #99). As distinct from the typical parish reader, these men will now exercise this ministry in a permanent way.

As part of the Rite, Bishop Zinkula will bless them, saying: "Grant that as they meditate constantly on your word they may grow in its wisdom and faithfully proclaim it to your people." In handing them a copy of the Scriptures, he reminds them to "be faithful to handing on the word of God, so that it may grow strong in the hearts of his people." As their formation continues, we ask that you please keep them and their families in your prayers.

There are three phases to the Deacon Formation Program: Inquiry, Aspirancy, and Candidacy During the Year of Inquiry, men and their families begin to more intentionally explore the possibility of a call to the diaconate. Aspirancy is "primarily a time to discern the capability and readiness of an aspirant to be nominated to the bishop for acceptance as a candidate for diaconal ordination" (*National Directory*, §182). According to the *National Directory*, the "Candidate path in diaconal formation is the occasion for continued discernment of a diaconal vocation and immediate preparation for ordination" (§204). The study of theology and related topics becomes a central part of the four-years of Candidacy. Pastoral field placement, parish ministry, and meetings with one's mentor and spiritual director continue. Please Pray for these men and all who may be called to a vocation in the Catholic Church

**Question:** Why do Catholics baptize babies?

Answer: For adults who want to be baptized, the celebration only takes place after a long, guided, and thoughtful process through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is also true for many Protestant Christians, who are baptized later in life, often after a personal, transforming religious experience. So, it seems fair to ask why our Catholic tradition includes infant baptism. After all, if we make adults who want to become Catholic wait months and even years as they grow in their understanding of Christ and

his teachings, why should babies — who "do nothing" — be baptized?

Our custom of infant baptism dates back to the earliest days of the Church, when St. Paul baptized entire households, including, we presume, children (see Acts 16:15, 33; 18:8). That had become common practice by the second century. When Christianity was legalized 200 years later, infant baptism became the normal practice throughout the Church. We recognize that in Baptism, we are given the grace to overcome original sin — the human tendency to choose ourselves and our own wills over God — and to become members of the Church. This is the gift we give to infants in Baptism.

In its essence, the baptism of infants also reminds us adult Christians that the gift of salvation and membership in the Church (i.e., the Body of Christ) is God's initiative. It is freely offered to us, regardless of where we might be in life's journey. Salvation isn't something we earn. Instead, we see that Baptism is the beginning of a lifelong process of growing into the kind of disciples that Jesus wants us to be.

#### What is meant by coming into full communion with the Church?

Coming into full communion with the Catholic Church describes the process for entrance into the Catholic Church for already baptized Christians. In most cases, these individuals make a profession of faith but are not baptized again. To prepare for this reception, the people, who are called Candidates, usually participate in a formation program to help them understand and experience the teachings and practices of the Catholic Church. Although some preparation may be with Catechumens preparing for baptism, the preparation for Candidates is different since they have already been baptized and committed to Jesus Christ, and many have also been active members of other Christian communities. The Candidates may be received into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil or at another Sunday during the year depending on pastoral circumstances and readiness of the Candidate.


